Queer Love, Chilling Mysteries, Untold Histories: Seriesly Berlin Premieres

Berlin, 3 September 2025 – Eight critically acclaimed international series will celebrate their world, international or German premieres during the **Seriesly Berlin** festival from 15 to 18 September 2025. The **Seriesly Berlin Premieres** will showcase an exclusive line-up of exciting series from around the globe – from Colombia to Germany, from Belgium to Canada, from Serbia to the Czech Republic, from France to Kazakhstan. Audiences can look forward to different genres such as queer drama, coming-of-age thriller, historical biopic, supernatural crime, musical drama and contemporary documentary series – all presented in Berlin before their German release. The screenings are open for everyone who loves high-quality series.

Three new screening locations in Berlin

Seriesly Berlin continues to grow and expand its footprint: in addition to returning to last year's screening venue Hackesche Höfe Kino, the festival will for the first time present series premieres at Colosseum Filmtheater and Fotografiska Berlin, which previously hosted the Conference only. Adding to the program, exclusive screenings will take place at Soho House Berlin, accessible to accredited industry guests and by invitation. Ticket sales start on 3 September. Regular tickets cost €10, reduced tickets for eligible groups €8 and can be purchased here.

Celebrity guests at Seriesly Berlin Premieres

Seriesly Berlin is proud to welcome prominent international guests to its premieres: From Germany Florence Kasumba, internationally known as the fierce Dora Milaje warrior Ayo in Marvel's *Black Panther* as well as Inspector Anaïs Schmitz in Germany's *Tatort*, she will be coming to the Berlin premiere of HOUSE OF BELLEVUE. Kazakh filmmaker and Un Certain Regard-nominee **Adilkhan Yerzhanov** (*The Gentle Indifference of the World*) will be in attendance for KAZAKH SCARY TALES. **Jonathan Michiels** (*Shutterspeed*) and **Jennifer Heylen** (*Noise*) will be attending the premiere of OH, OTTO! while Serbian creator and author **Ivan Knežević** (*The Seed*) and actress **Anita Ognjanović** (*The Beheading of St John the Baptist*) will join audiences for ABSOLUTE HUNDRED co-created by Srdan Golubović (Berlinale Panorama audience award & Prize of Ecumenical Jury).

From Europe to the Americas: Eight international series premiering at Seriesly Berlin

From Serbia comes **ABSOLUTE HUNDRED**, a tense thriller where young shooting champion Sonja (Anita Ognjanović) is forced to take justice into her own hands; Colombia's **EVE'S RIB**, directed by James Camargo De Alba, follows queer youth exploring love and identity under the threat of a serial killer; **GEORGE, UNTAMED SPIRIT** from France is Rodolphe Tissot's lush biopic of the defiant writer George Sand. Germany's **HOUSE OF BELLEVUE** dives into Berlin's ballroom scene through Emm's search for belonging. In **KAZAKH SCARY TALES**, Adilkhan Yerzhanov blends crime and folklore as an investigator facing infant disappearances tied to an ancient curse. Czech thriller **MOLOCH FILES** by Lukáš Hanulák, hurls a journalist and online sleuth into a deadly web of politics and espionage.



Belgium's hyped bittersweet dramedy **OH**, **OTTO!** by Stijn van Kerkhoven follows Otto (Jonathan Michiels) on a messy journey of heartbreak and queer self-discovery in Brussels, while Canadian documentary series **SANAJIIT** (INUIT MAKERS) by Susan Avingaq, Gabriela Gamez and Carol Kunnuk, immerses viewers in the traditional craft and creative spirit of the Inuit honoring their traditions and craftsmanship. Selected screenings are presented in partnership with **Doxumentale** and **Fantasy Film Fest**.

Seriesly Berlin Conference aiming to show the unexpected

Alongside the public screenings the industry is gathering at the **Seriesly Berlin Conference** (17–18 September), taking place at Berlin's iconic Fotografiska museum. The conference brings stories to life through lively panels and hands-on workshops, where fresh voices, unexpected collaborations, and bold ideas take center stage. Highlights include discussions on fashion as a narrative force, the future of financing and co-productions, queer and horror storytelling in TV, and collaborative Palestinian-Israeli writing initiatives, alongside practical sessions for producers and writers. Complementing the panels, the <u>Seriesly Berlin Pitches</u> (17 September) present a global slate of 16 new projects spanning continents and genres: from Taiwanese-Korean crime thrillers and Nigerian historical sagas to Slovakian drama, German musical series, and Franco-German collaborations, as well as experimental formats like animated sitcoms and queer comedy. Nineteen-year-old Sonja is a junior champion in shooting. Her mother lives abroad, and her father, a war veteran, has fallen so far into debt that he, Sonja, and her older brother may be forced out of their home. Her brother tries to solve the situation through shady dealings, but when he ends up witnessing a crime he becomes the target of a local thug. In order to protect her family, Sonja decides to take justice into her own hands.
